Oregon OSHA - Adopted Changes To Various Rules in General Industry To Remove Several References to Consensus Standards

This rulemaking is to keep Oregon OSHA in harmony with recent changes to Federal OSHA's standards. We are removing several references to consensus standards that have requirements that duplicate, or are comparable to, other OR-OSHA rules; this action includes correcting a paragraph citation in one of these rules. We are also removing a reference to American Welding Society standard A3.0-1969 ("Terms and Definitions") in our general industry welding standards. This rulemaking is part of a continuing effort to update references to consensus and industry standards used throughout our rules.

OR-OSHA adopts the changes in general industry as published in the December 14, 2007 Federal Register with the following exceptions:

Division 2/H, 1910.94(c)(1)(ii), and (3) - **In Oregon 437-002-0107 Spray Finishing applies.**

Division 2/H, 1910.107 - In Oregon 437-002-0107 Spray Finishing applies. Division 2/R, 1910.261 - In Oregon 437-002-0312 Oregon Rules for Pulp, Paper, and Paperboard Mills applies.

A reference to American National Standard Safety Requirements for Explosive-Actuated Fastening Tools, ANSI A10.3-1995 is removed in Division 4/P, Agriculture/Small Tools.

This is OR-OSHA Administrative Order 7-2008, adopted and effective May 30, 2008.
