## **Changes Adopted - General Industry, Construction, and Maritime**

Federal OSHA published in the January 5, 2005 Federal Register amendments to remove and revise provisions of its standards that are outdated, duplicative, unnecessary, or inconsistent, or can be clarified or simplified by being written in plain language. Most of these changes are in the health standards in general industry, construction, and shipyard employment. The December 6, 2004 Federal Register, makes a correction to a cross reference in Methylenedianiline in construction. We also repealed an Oregon-initiated rule that has effective dates that have passed a number of years ago and is no longer necessary. A nonmandatory appendix to OAR 437-002-0161, Medical and First Aid, was added.
