## Pesticide Application Information Posting Requirement

The Worker Protection Standard (WPS), at §170.122 Providing Specific Information about Applications, requires agricultural employers to display certain information about pesticide applications when workers are on an agricultural establishment and, within the last 30 days, a pesticide covered by the WPS has been applied on the establishment or a restricted-entry interval (REI) has been in effect.

**Location and accessibility:** This information must be displayed in the same location as the WPS pesticide safety poster, must be accessible to employees, and kept legible for the period that the poster is required to be displayed.

**Timing:** If workers will be on the establishment during application, the information must be posted before the application takes place. Otherwise, the information must be posted at the beginning of any worker's first work period. The information must be displayed for at least 30 days after the end of the REI. If there is no REI, it must be displayed for at least 30 days after the end of the establishment, whichever is earlier.

## **Required information must include:**

- The location and description of the treated area.
- The product name, EPA registration number, and active ingredient(s) of the pesticide.
- The time and date the pesticide is to be applied.
- The restricted-entry interval for the pesticide.
