# **Lessons Learned & Safety Suggestions:**

Dennis: Had a couple incidents/ near miss. Scissor lift being set up and a near miss.

Neither employee was certified so work was stopped.

Heavy equipment knocked over fence, operator was not certified/trained.

Make sure employees are trained and authorized to do the work.

Sean: burnout- 3 incidents recently. Rear-ended a car. Hammered own finger. Trying to move pipe by him self and slipped and broke finger.

Don't know how to curb it.

Joaquin has been seeing it to. We had an all staff discussion on burn out. There is a lot going on in people personal lives and at work that is accumulating the pressure.

Robert: Look at the near misses, we should target our tool box safety meetings and gearing them toward the work being done.

# **Continuing Business: Status of Rule Making:**

We are continuing to move forward on <u>Wildfire Smoke</u> and <u>Excessive Heat</u> rule: working on a draft rule. The temporary rule will expire in December so we are trying to get the rule together to propose before the next season. Have a proposal out by the end of the month, and an eye toward adopting early next year.

Economic Impact Survey that was sent out for the Heat Smoke: Do we have any data on that?

-We extended the deadline and we are still reviewing those responses. There was a lot more focus on labor housing.

#### Oregon OSHA COVID-19 rulemaking:

In May we took out the masking requirement in a temporary process along with some others Federal OSHA has a hearing in the 6<sup>th</sup> District Court on the Stay of the Federal ETS. We are just thinking about what we would do if the Feds say we have to, but since they are still waiting on the courts, we will not do anything.

We have 5 rulemaking that we will be working on this month. Employer Knowledge is still being worked on.

We have rulemaking on pause that we will start working on again as soon as we can. Non-entry firefighting, Lead, and a standard improvement process: just to clean up some language and grammatical issues.

Best Practice: stair type scaffolding. Put in a daily inspection tag on them.

Backup cameras: does Oregon OSHA have an interpretation on backup alarms being disarmed because they have backup cameras?

-it would be a case by case. But believe it would be an enhancement of safety to have both. I don't think we have anything on that so we would need to look at what federal OSHA has.

The backup alarm and the spotter lets others know what is happening, the backup camera only lets the driver know what it going on.

Steve: noticing multiple jobsites with front end loaders that have a muted alarm sound. Is there a disciple requirement?

There is a white noise alarm now that is being used in place of the beeping ones.
